What is BCNLIP Languages?

Types of classes

BCNLIP Idiomas is a language school created by its director and educator Sofía Pariente Buzón in 2008. Our name, BCNLIP, represents the teaching philosophy we wish to convey: Language Immersion Programs in Barcelona, where students learn the language by experiencing it to the fullest.

At BCNLIP, our hybrid classes allow you to practice Spanish with classmates who are both in the classroom and online, connecting from anywhere in the world. Our classrooms are equipped with all the necessary technology to make these classes a reality.

In our school we teach the two official languages of Catalonia: Spanish, which is also official throughout Spain and in 20 other countries, and Catalan, which is a co-official language in Catalonia, the Balearic Islands and the Valencian Community (where it is called Valencian), as well as being an official language in Andorra.

Types of classes

1. In-person classes

In-person classes, as the name suggests, are those that students must attend at the school. You'll have the opportunity to learn in a traditional way, using all five senses, and you'll also be able to enjoy all the technological advancements used in language classes today, as well as share experiences and the course you're enrolled in. It's essential to understand that you must attend classes in person to enjoy complete language immersion and only attend online for justifiable reasons that prevent you from coming to the school. It's also important to remember that if you enrolled in in-person classes and have a student visa, you need to attend your classes in person; otherwise, the school is obligated to notify Immigration that you no longer need a student visa, since you will be attending online.

2. Hybrid classes

The hybrid class format offers the opportunity to practice Spanish with classmates both in person and those connecting online from anywhere in the world. It's an innovative approach that combines in-person classroom learning with online participation from their devices. This allows all students to interact in both formats, creating a dynamic environment where online students feel like they're participating in a face-to-face class. In the classroom, you'll have access to all the necessary technology to make this type of class possible.



What is BCNLIP Languages? Services

What does the BCNLIP registration fee cover?

Your registration includes an information pack about the course you've enrolled in, the first textbook, access to the school's computers, and free Wi-Fi. You'll also have free access to our new online platform at bcnlip.es. In addition, you can enjoy the cultural activities we regularly organize at our center.

What services does BCNLIP offer?

- The school has access for people with disabilities: entrances with ramps and a grab bar in the bathroom.
- Computers available for teachers and students
- Free access to our online learning platform at bcnlip.es
- Book and movie rentals
- Customer service via mobile phone, email and social media
- Support for international students to obtain official documents such as NIE, rental contracts or student visas.
- Monthly activities: cultural events, outings.
- Language immersion activities included in the courses.

- Certificate of completion upon finishing the course
- Parcel and mail collection service

Classroom temperature

Article 29 of Royal Decree-Law 14/2022 states that:

- a) The air temperature in heated spaces should not exceed 19°C (66°F). The environment is considered cold when the temperature falls below 15°C (59°F).
- b) The air temperature in refrigerated spaces must not be lower than 27°C (80°F). The environment is considered hot when the temperature exceeds 27°C (80°F).

These are the temperature limits for heating and air conditioning in all schools. The school sets its air conditioning to 24°C (75°F), which is in line with regulations.

Connection: hybrid classes

Each class has a WhatsApp group to which you will receive an invitation. You will find direct links to your classes in the group description. You will join the classes via Zoom. You need to download the application and click on the link. The meeting link will remain the same until further notice. If you have any questions, click [here](#) to watch an explanatory video.

We suggest:

- Use headphones
- Increase the device volume
- Do not use your mobile phone

We ask you:

- Don't leave the screen black (it's a bit frustrating for your teachers and classmates)
- Be punctual.
- Please be patient (sometimes there may be sound or connection problems)

Each class has a WhatsApp chat. Remember that you have booked a specific class time. WhatsApp should be used or you should contact the teacher during class hours. Teachers are not obligated to respond outside of their working hours.

Technical issues

Our team responsible for troubleshooting and assisting with these issues will be happy to help and will do their best to resolve them immediately. Mission and vision

How do we teach at BCNLIP? Teaching Method

We designed our courses so that our students can communicate from day one. Our classes are specifically designed to allow students to practice the language through activities related to various everyday situations, using a task-based approach.

One of the main objectives of this teaching method focuses on learning a second language through the same natural process that occurs in the acquisition of the mother tongue.

Adult learners, just like babies, need to learn a language to communicate effectively in various aspects of their daily lives. In short, language learning is not merely an isolated classroom activity where students receive information and apply it systematically. Rather, it is a life experience in which learners perceive it as a process linked to their ability to communicate in different facets of life. Of course, unlike children, adults are provided with all the necessary tools and resources to progress effectively and dynamically in their learning. In class, we cover all the aspects of language required for proper development: the four language skills, grammar, vocabulary and semantics, as well as cultural references. Furthermore, we provide our students with learning strategies that are useful for their progress in the classroom.

Mission

At BCNLIP, we are dedicated to teaching Spanish through linguistic and cultural immersion programs that allow our students to experience the language in all its dimensions. Since 2008, we have supported both those who wish to fully integrate into Barcelona life and those who come for short stays to learn about its language and culture. As part of the MONLIP educational network, we promote a close-knit, intercultural, and inclusive educational approach, where language is a tool for connection, understanding, and personal growth.

Vision

We aspire for BCNLIP to be a leading center for language education within the MONLIP network, consolidating our role as a space for intercultural connection in Barcelona. We believe that learning a language is the first step towards understanding a culture and achieving genuine integration. Our goal is to continue building more conscious, equitable, and connected communities, where cultural and linguistic immersion drives personal and social transformation, both for those who come to stay and for those who visit us temporarily.

Cultural immersion program



At BCNLIP Language School, we encourage our students to use Spanish in real-world contexts and develop skills that empower them to learn independently. The school adheres to the regulations of the Instituto Cervantes and the latest trends in language teaching. Below, you will find more information about the program.

Barcelona Immersion: dive in, discover and tell your Barcelona story

With the Barcelona Immersion program, in addition to the general course –in which we follow Spanish teaching manuals adapted to the level of each group–, students participate in classes and activities that will help them immerse themselves more and more deeply in the language and local culture.

From Monday to Thursday, students attend classes focused on cultural and linguistic immersion, which they record in an independent workbook. Here, they learn to explore the city in Spanish. The program aims to enable students to describe Barcelona as if it were their own city, create guides, and write articles of interest.

In addition, from Monday to Thursday, students have half an hour of independent group work each day. Fridays include tutorials, cultural outings, and cultural and linguistic workshops.

- **Tutoring** – In tutoring sessions, a teacher answers the group's questions and helps them with their independent workbook.
- **Cultural outings** – Cultural outings are routes in which the teacher goes with the group through the neighborhoods of Barcelona, explaining their history and sharing interesting facts about the city (starting September 12).
- **Cultural and linguistic workshops** – Classes that cover topics such as writing and film (starting September 12).



• **Events** – Students are invited to participate in the events on the school's cultural agenda, an activity that they also have to record in their learning

Cultural immersion program

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- **Events** – Students are invited to participate in the events on the school's cultural agenda, an activity that they also have to record in their learning notebooks.

Summary of the workload:

- 8 hours of general course + 8 hours of immersion (includes 2 autonomous hours): 16 fixed hours.
- To reach 20 hours per week, students can choose between tutorials (2 hours), outings (4 hours), workshops (2 hours) and events (4 hours).

The Inmersión Barcelona cultural immersion program has different stages depending on the student's level:

- **Arriving: Living in Barcelona (A1)** – Learn how to introduce yourself, ask for simple information, find your way around, shop, and use public transport. Gain confidence to handle basic everyday situations.
- **The first steps: Living in Spain (A2)** – Move towards independence: make appointments, carry out simple procedures and understand rules and services. Write short messages and emails in an appropriate format.
- **In-depth exploration: Spain in depth (B1)** – Understand and recount key aspects of history and culture. Summarize essential information and express opinions clearly.
- **The Discovery: Barcelona in Depth (B1/B2)** – Research neighborhoods, compare options, and manage plans. Create helpful guides and reviews to make informed decisions.

- **Integration:** Barcelona in the First Person (B2) – Design and lead small activities as a guide. Recommend routes and explain the city accurately, adapting to the audience.
- **Narrative: Chronicles of Barcelona (C1/C2)** – Create chronicles and reports about the city, integrating various sources. Moderate complex conversations and act as a bridge between perspectives.

Evaluation in the immersion program

- At least 80% in-person attendance is required.
- In the general course, the evaluation is carried out through the final exam.
- In the immersion program, the work done in class and the personal notebook are assessed.
- Attendance at workshops, tutorials, and events also counts in the evaluation.
- With this program, students not only learn and improve their Spanish, but also learn to live and enjoy it in Barcelona. Each week, a different topic is explored from a linguistic, cultural, and social perspective, while progressing along the learning path.



Permanent activities

At BCNLIP, we believe that learning goes beyond the classroom. That's why we organize ongoing activities throughout the year, designed to help our students get to know the school and their classmates, interact across cultures, discover the local culture, and fully integrate into life in Barcelona.

We offer two free, recurring events that are especially valued by our students and open to the entire school community. The events are supervised by a teacher or facilitator.

Welcome breakfasts

Each month, we welcome new students from all disciplines with a special breakfast. It's an opportunity to meet the team, understand our mission, and share expectations in a relaxed and friendly atmosphere.



Permanent activities

Flamenco Sessions in Las Brujas

We also organize private flamenco sessions each month at Las Brujas gallery in the Gothic Quarter. These sessions are coordinated by Jero Férec, a flamenco guitarist with a distinguished career in Spain, who manages the space and collaborates with top-tier artists from the local flamenco scene. It's an authentic, high-quality experience, very close to live art.

Both events are free but have limited capacity. Registration information is sent a few days or a week in advance via social media and WhatsApp groups.



Cultural agenda

At BCNLIP, we place great importance on extracurricular activities as an integral part of our students' development and integration. Our students have their own schedule of diverse activities, mostly academic in nature, but also including parties and other recreational activities. Furthermore, all students at the school are welcome to attend events organized by or involving the BCNLIP Foundation, another center within our network of schools, and to participate in all the excursions offered exclusively to our students by Mamut Hiking.

BCNLIP students can attend events and excursions offered by the BCNLIP Foundation, our center dedicated to teaching Spanish from a social and humanitarian perspective, and to community work and activities. The cultural agenda can be found in the table to the side.

In collaboration with the BCNLIP Educational Foundation

These activities are part of our collaboration with the BCNLIP Educational Foundation, whose mission is to connect migrants and foreigners with local culture and serve as a bridge for intercultural communication.

For this reason, much of our cultural agenda is geared towards creating shared spaces between BCNLIP students, students from other schools and local people, through cultural events, solidarity events and popular celebrations.

Welcome program: Introduction to Spanish

During your first week at BCNLIP, if you are an A1 level student, you will have four extra classes called the Welcome Program (Introduction to Spanish). In these classes, you will get to know our school, our educational community, and have your first contact with the language.

These sessions are mainly conducted in English (and a little bit in Spanish), but don't worry: your teacher will make sure everyone understands everything, even if you don't speak English very well!

In addition, you can download the manuals in several languages: English, Spanish, French, and Russian.

This is how your adventure with Spanish at BCNLIP begins!



Library collection and reading spaces

At the Avinyó school, we have a collection of books in Spanish and other languages, as well as manuals for learning and teaching Spanish as a Foreign Language (ELE). We also have some audiovisual materials.

The first reading area is located right at the school entrance. There you'll find a large wooden table, very comfortable armchairs, and a bench where you can sit and read or review your work in peace.

In addition, there are three more reading or study areas in the corridor leading to the classrooms, each with its own seat. At reception you can consult the catalog and find out about the lending service.

The second reading space is in room 7. This place is used for tutoring or registration between 11:00 and 17:00, and outside of those hours (from 9:00 to 11:00 and from 17:00 to 21:00) it functions as a space for learning, reading or disconnecting.

In this room you will find recommendations for your studies, access to the bibliographic collection and also information about other reading spaces in the city.

DELE 2025 Exam Preparation and Dates

The DELE exams are the best way to certify your level of Spanish. They are internationally recognized, both in academic and business settings. In France, they are recognized by the French Ministry of Education. Nationally, numerous institutions accept these diplomas.

- Ministry of Justice: DELE A2 or higher to apply for Spanish nationality.
- Ministry of Health: DELE C1 or C2 to access MIF and FIR (Medicine and Pharmacy) positions
- General State Administration and public bodies: these qualifications are valid for carrying out any academic or professional activity in Spain.
- Recognition of studies abroad: the DELE C2 allows you to skip other Spanish proficiency tests.

You can obtain the DELE diploma at all levels: A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, and C2. Did you know that at BCNLIP you can take the exam and obtain your DELE diploma? We are an examination center for all levels and regularly participate in all the exam sessions organized by the Cervantes Institute. Therefore, throughout the year, we offer DELE courses at the most requested levels: A2, B1, B2, and C1. Our intensive courses already include preparation for the exam.

Exámenes oficiales: DELE, SIELE, CCSE

Exam SOULS

SIELE (International Spanish Language Assessment Service) is a system that certifies your Spanish proficiency through electronic platforms. It is designed for students and professionals worldwide.

It is a multi-level exam that allows you to obtain the SIELE certificate: a document that is graded from 0 to 1000. The result is obtained by adding the score of the 4 sections and is linked to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

In this test, you can select the competencies you wish to register for. There are four other types of exams that are based on a combination of different tests:

- Skills to understand what we read and hear.
- Reading comprehension, writing, and writing skills.
- Listening comprehension and oral expression and interaction skills.
- Verbal communication and oral interaction skills

CCSE exam

The test of constitutional and sociocultural knowledge of Spain (CCSE test) is an examination test developed by the Cervantes Institute that evaluates, through different tasks, the knowledge of the Constitution and of the Spanish social and cultural reality, it is one of the requirements established in the laws for the acquisition of nationality for residents in Spain.

The test consists of five tasks with 25 multiple-choice (3 closed-response options) or true/false questions on constitutional and sociocultural knowledge of Spain. It lasts a total of 45 minutes.

When can I take the CCSE exam?

Use of the cafeteria

You can enjoy our café for as long as you like. It's essential that you keep the area clean: don't leave crumbs, wrappers, or dirty cups. Make sure to close all containers tightly after use. We ask that you be mindful of the environment and only take what you plan to consume.

We suggest you bring your own water bottle or refillable cup. If you need to buy a cup, you can ask at reception if they have any for sale.

You can also buy items from our vending or coffee machines; availability in this case varies depending on each center.

Lost items

Please take care of your belongings; the school is not responsible for lost items. If you find something that isn't yours, please leave it at reception. If you have left something behind at school, please ask at reception about your lost item. The school has security cameras at the entrance and reception, so you can request a video if needed.

Library

At our C/Avinyó, 50 location, we have a wide variety of textbooks, notebooks, and novels that you can borrow to study at home. You also have access to our library, where you'll find plenty of educational materials to support your learning. Your teacher or the reception staff can help you choose books. Ask at reception about our lending system. We'll require a deposit (€20), and you can borrow the book for one month. The receptionist will give you a deposit receipt and add you to the borrowing list.

In addition, there are reading and study areas throughout the facilities. At Avinyó 50, Room 6 can be used as a reading area from 9 to 11 a.m. and from 5 to 9 p.m. The entrance table can be used as a reading and study space during the rest of the day. You can also request a laptop to use in this area if needed.

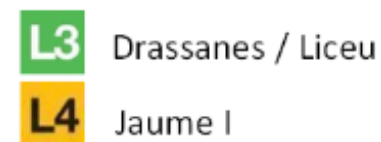
